Abandoned art exhibit now in Halton Hills

A photography exhibit featuring the work of Greg Coman and Alan McCord begins Saturday at the Side Door Gallery in Georgetown.

Where and how we live, work, and play encompasses much of our existence. Our homes, businesses, and so on, influence feelings of what it means to be human and often help define what is meant by accomplishment. Owning a nice home, having a successful business, driving a nice car; these things are a part of many dreams both from vesterday and tomorrow.

When dreams are given over to rust, cobwebs, and memories, feelings of emptiness, desolation, and stillness often emerge.

Abandoned spaces and objects, while seemingly unwanted and silently embodying dreams and lives past, can also be eerily beautiful in their vacancy where vacancy can sometimes refer to an opening or opportunity or something available for new use.

Abandoned is a collection of photographic images by photographers Coman and McCord that explores these mixed thoughts and feelings.

From decaying houses to vacant lots, from rusted out automobiles to derelict gas stations, from old hotels and restaurants to vacant paper mills Abandoned asks viewers to consider or reconsider our ideas about humanity along with what we see as contribution to what is deemed accomplishment in our lives.

A closer look at abandoned places and things provides a doorway into the past, evidence revealing that the transient fragility of human creation cannot withstand the strength and eternity of nature. Sometimes where these two worlds meet is where a unique dynamic emerges, said Coman.

Both haunting and hopeful, the imagery in Abandoned depicts the silent reminders of what many held dear and invite viewers to consider these things in a different light.

Decay and transition are a part of our lives and can represent both loss and hope, said McCord.

want to build a fence and make a few other landscaping changes to my property. How can I find the bars on my property? Can I use an old survey I have?

: Knowing the location of your boundary is important in order to avoid a costly dispute as a result of the incorrect location of a fence or other structure. By law, only a licenced Ontario Land Surveyor can mark property boundaries.

It is sometimes difficult to locate survey monuments as they may be buried deep beneath your lawn or maybe not set directly on your property corner. Bars and stakes may rot away, become displaced by construction activities, or even be removed by angry neighbours. If you rely on your own location estimates you are assuming a lot of risk. Having an Ontario Land Surveyor locate your boundary is a cost effective choice when compared to the cost of moving a fence- or having a neighbour take you to court.

Take caution when relying on information shown on old survey plans as the details may be out of date, unreliable, or not sufficient for your current needs. Survey plans are prepared at a specific time for a specific purpose and the situation may change over time. A new up-to-date survey will provide all the information you need before you build your fence or make other landscaping changes.
