

Nashville North faces criticism for bra-free event

A breast-free or bra-free event is a breast cancer awareness event every one has seen, with one twist.

On Thursday night (Oct. 13), Nashville North in North East of a No Bra Day event to support breast cancer awareness.

The event lasted less than an hour for women attending. It took about a week to set up. The organizers learned a lesson that a woman's chest whose nipples could be seen through a gown skirt.

The club said the event was in support of breast cancer awareness month and had been scheduled for a week, but because of a Nashville North Facebook page did it say where the proceeds go.

Melissa is a local resident and calls herself a "gender warrior" who has taken personal business to breast cancer. Last year Melissa underwent a double mastectomy and wishes to be anonymous because she said she is not ready to publicly announce her diagnosis.

It's really good to know that my percentage has gone down to less than three per cent, she said. Not dealing with scarring and everything else. It's really, really hard. And she is not an event like this, that just seems so insensitive to women who

have only have one breast or that breast are obligated because they do have those organs. The women in my group and women like me and all the women that have had breast cancer had it incredibly mean.

The event was targeted to people celebrating breast cancer awareness month, but Melissa said the people at the event would be aware of it because of attacking something like that.

The women who don't have their perfect breasts are already very sensitive because of what they've gone through, she said.

And there to put it out there and be like, oh these women are going through this, it's just a small event, it has nothing to do with being targeted to.

The event's Facebook page said the event raised \$1,000 for the Breast Cancer Center.

Yesterday was International No Bra Day in support of Breast Cancer Awareness. This initiative was brought to my attention by wonderful young women on our message board team. We always support cancer initiatives, but many breast cancer research, fund drives annually and will continue to do so. This year we are honored to have been chosen to host a Princess Margaret Hospital Foundation event. We understand that people are free to express their opinions

as we are also proud to represent in our way. This incident is about awareness of a terrible disease that affects not only women, but also men, maternal children in the families of all affected (sic) by breast cancer. We remain proud and grateful to our journal of awareness and funds for the fight. Cancer can be beaten, said Andrea in a video.

Andrea added that both her mother and grandmother had breast cancer.

Messages were left for Cancer Awareness Network Nashville (CAN) but the organization did not want to comment.

Another Georgetown resident, Melissa Thorne, was shocked to see the poster and threatened the advertisement on a number of Facebook groups, leaving a one-star review on the club's page stating her concerns.

I was just shocked, Thorne said. Originally, I was just shocked at the picture itself that somebody would think it was appropriate to see that photo in a public, let alone related to the topic.

Having a bra-free event in support of breast cancer awareness (breast cancer surgery awareness and support) is deplorable. There are women who are on the club's Facebook page. Additionally, you have no control as to how much of your content has to be actually be done.
