

Rabies clinic takes place this Saturday at Old Armoury

The Old Armoury, 1A Park Ave. Georgetown, is the location of a Rabies and Microchip Clinic for cats and dogs on Saturday, October 29, 9-12 p.m., sponsored by Dr. Kara Gray.

North Halton Kitten Rescue volunteers will attend to the clerical tasks and payments as Dr. Gray and her team of veterinarians and veterinarian technicians administer three-year rabies vaccines to pets 16 weeks and older, trim nails and implant microchips.

A microchip is comparable in size to a grain of rice, doesn't cause discomfort for your pet and is usually inserted under the skin between the shoulder blades.

Dogs found by canine control or cats and dogs found by individuals and taken to a veterinary clinic will be scanned for a chip and the pet's owner identified and contacted.

The first 80 microchips purchased at the clinic will be \$10. Pet Valu North, Global Pet Foods and Pet Valu South have joined with NHKR to subsidize the costs of 80 chips to encourage more people to chip their pets, especially indoor cats who by mishap may end up outdoors.



The rabies clinic will take place at the Old Armoury this Saturday from 9-12 p.m.

Please have your pet leashed or in a carrier. Courtesy carriers, collars and leashes will be available for those needing to borrow them.

Cash only. \$30 per microchip. Rabies is \$20, and nail clipping is \$10. The NHKR is grateful for the support from the community and will be the recipient of this fundraiser.
