

Dickinson nets OT winner in AHL season debut with Stars

Having missed the start of the American Hockey League regular season due to injury, second-year forward Jason Dickinson made an emphatic return to the Texas Stars lineup last week in Tuscon, Ariz.

The 21-year-old centre potted the winner in overtime in the Stars 4-3 victory over the Roadrunners and got into a second-period scrap with fellow first-round NHL draft pick Ryan MacInnis.

Dickinson snapped in the clinching marker from the top of the right faceoff circle with 1:09 remaining in the ex-

tra period.

The Georgetown native led Texas in game-winning goals in his rookie campaign, in which he scored 22 times and added 31 assists in 73 games.

Taken 29th overall by the Dallas Stars in 2013, the 6-foot-1, 195-pound Dickinson had hoped to crack the opening-night roster of the parent club this season but had to undergo hip surgery in September.

Dallas has had to call up several players from its AHL affiliate due to a rash of injuries.
