

# No estimated costs for wastewater plan in Erin expansion

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Any new subdivisions would be on sewers and paying their share.

The current Wellington County Official Plan projects that even with wastewater treatment, the Erin population would rise by only 2,995 residents (up 24 per cent) by 2036.

Solmar Development Corp, which wants to build a 1,240-home subdivision, plus a commercial-industrial zone in north Erin Village, has appealed that projection to the Ontario Municipal Board.

Solmar says the low projection does not recognize the potential to accommodate additional population, and that it is premature to set a target before the current Environmental Assessment is done.

Council has committed to fully engaging the public through an Official Plan amendment process in 2017 to determine how large our community wishes to grow.

The EA started in 2009, and completion is expected in 2018.

Joe Mullan, president of the

Ainley Group, which is conducting the Wastewater Environmental Assessment, said the growth numbers represent what is possible from a purely engineering perspective.

He said revisions have been made to the Assimilative Capacity Study (ACS), which measures the long-term flow of the river, especially during low-flow periods, and the impact of sewage effluent.

The issues will be discussed at a meeting of the Public Liaison Committee on Nov. 24. It is open for

public attendance only. Residents can fully participate at a meeting planned for January.

No costs have been estimated for the wastewater plan. Mullan said a complete cost analysis, including impact on individual homeowners, will be done once they come up with recommendations on the collection and treatment technologies.

In 2014, CVC vigorously defended the MOE's 6,000 urban population cap for Erin. They were asked

what has changed since then.

Gary Murphy, CVC's Director of Planning and Development Services, said, CVC has, since 2013, collected new streamflow data in the vicinity of the proposed treatment outfall and it has assisted in improving the low flow estimate, but CVC has not received the revised assimilative capacity study on which the news release was based and cannot comment further until it has an opportunity to review the study to verify its findings.
