
ELVIS: BLUE CHRISTMAS" COMES TO GEORGETOWN THEATRE

Snowy winter headed Halton's way

If local residents haven t put on their winter tires yet, now is the time to do it, meteorologists advise.

One thing to keep in mind is its not just for the snow, it s also for temperatures. Winter tires perform better (less than) 7 C than all season or summer tires. So, with the cold, it's probably best to get them on this week, Dayna Vettese, a meteorologist with Oakville-based The Weather Network.

We did have some flurry in the area last weekend and we do anticipate some snow or slushy snow Wednesday leading into Thursday, so it s time, it s happening. We re moving into winter.

The local weather specialty network released its winter forecast Tuesday, saying it will be a lot harsher than last year.

If you can recall last winter, it s probably not going to look a whole lot like that, Vettese said. We were very warm. December, we were running about 6 C above average; January was warm. We did have a cold spell in February last year. Aside from that, we were warm.

But this year, the meteorologist noted the Great Lakes region and the Greater Toronto Area (GTA) could expect near below normal temperatures to make things look and feel a lot more like winter than last year.

On average, Vettese said the area is typically around 0 C to -2 C for daytime highs throughout the winter, but she anticipates, on average, temperatures being a few degrees below that this winter.

The silver lining is while a couple of daily cold records may be broken throughout the season, Vettese doesn t believe any all-time records may need to be reset thankfully, the record-breaking cold winter of 2013-14 set the bar pretty high.

As for whether or not it will be a white Christmas this year, Vettese predicts residents will have a better chance of seeing one this winter than last.

That's because the GTA is going to be impacted more this upcoming season by lake-

Typically, that isn t the case for the area, but because the lakes are running so warm right now, the GTA is set up for some pretty decent lake-effect snow, said Vettese.

We re actually anticipating a snowier winter than what we saw last year. It s probably best to get the snow blower prepped, the shovels ready because we are going to need them this winter unlike last, she added.
