Local man killed, woman sent to hospital after collision

Halton Regional Police responded to a fatal collision on Five Sideroad and Fifth Line where a 30-year-old man lost his life early last Thursday morning.

At approximately 12:34 a.m., a GMC Envoy traveling westbound on 5 Sideroad control and entered a ditch.

The driver, a Halton Hills resident, was pronounced dead at the scene.

The passenger, who is a 23-year-old woman from Saskatoon, Sask., was transported to Hamilton General Hospital with life-threatening injuries and is said to be in critical condition.

The road was closed for several hours while police investigated the area and Halton Hills Hydro crews repaired a damaged utility pole, which was struck at the time of the collision.
