Suspects sought after jackets taken from Toronto Premium Outlets



Halton Regional Police are looking for two young males following the brazen theft of four jackets from a Halton Hills retail store.

The men, believed to be in their early 20s, entered the Columbia Sportswear store at Toronto Premium Outlets on Tuesday, Nov. 15 at around 6:30 p.m. and walked directly to the rear of the premises.

They allegedly took multiple jackets over a three-minute span and carried them to the front of the store, grabbed another, and then ran out of the store without making an attempt to pay.

The four jackets taken are estimated to be valued at \$800-\$1,000.

The first suspect is described as 57-59 with a heavy build, and short brown hair, wearing blue jeans, a red zip-up hooded jacket and white running shoes.

Suspect two is 59-511 with

a slim build and short dark hair, wearing a black baseball cap with a large white logo, black Adidas track pants marked with three white stripes on each leg, a red Air Jordan hooded sweater and red running shoes.

The pair is each facing a charge of theft under \$5,000.

Georgetown connection to heroin trafficking charges

A suspicious package destined for an address in Georgetown resulted in the arrest of an Etobicoke man on drug charges.

Halton Regional Police's Drug & Morality Unit announced last week it had concluded a two-month heroin importation investigation.

Nearly one kilogram of heroin was seized as a result of a joint effort between the HRPS, Canada Border Services Agency, U.S. Homeland Security Investigations and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police.

In early October, police were alerted about a parcel that was allegedly intended to be delivered to a Georgetown mailbox.

Subsequent investigation led to the arrest of a male suspect on Nov. 7 and the seizure of additional suspicious packages containing heroin in Port Perry, Ont.

The drug was allegedly concealed in various household items, including purses and children's toys.

Charged with three counts each of importing heroin and possession for the purpose of trafficking is Innocent Annih, 47.
