Project Juno targets impaired drivers in Halton Hills

Impaired drivers beware.

On Dec. 1, Halton Regional Police officers from the Milton and Georgetown stations will launch their annual impaired driving enforcement campaign.

The initiative, dubbed Project Juno, will run through to the New Year.

Additional officers will be on patrol evenings when people are traditionally attending parties and gatherings for the Christmas season.

Recently, officers conducted a roadside screening device project where they visited area bars and restaurants in an effort to educate customers and serving

Based on a series of voluntary breath tests conducted in the establishments licensed to serve alcohol, 15 drivers were discouraged from driving when they learned that they would have failed a roadside breathalyzer test and been ar-

Educating and informing Canadians about the dangers and consequences of impaired driving is an important part of our work. Information alone will not end impaired driving, but the majority of people when fully informed of the risks, both to themselves and others will make the right choices and never get behind the wheel impaired, stated a Halton police press release.

Impaired driving means operating a including cars, trucks, boats, snowmobiles and off-road vehicles



while under the influence of alcohol or

It is a Criminal Code offence and could lead to losing your licence, having your vehicle impounded, needing to pay an administrative penalty, having to attend an education or treatment program, being fined upon conviction, being required to pay for the installation of an ignition interlock device in your vehicle, possibly spending time in jail and having a permanent criminal record.

Residents can expect to see increased Reduce Impaired Driving Everywhere (RIDE) spot checks in all locations within Halton.

Officers will partner with volunteers from Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD) Canada to thank those drivers who make the responsible decisions to drive sober.
