## Serious multiple car collision closes 5th Line on Sunday

A serious personal injury collision closed Fifth Line between Hwy7 and the 32nd Sideroad for four and a half hours on Sunday, November 27. The incident involved three cars and occurred shortly after 11 a.m.

A 72 year old Hillsburgh man was in a vehicle travelling southbound on Fifth Line north of Bridlewood Boulevard with his 66 year old wife. The driver swerved into the northbound lane in order to avoid a vehicle driven by a 22 year old Halton Hills man pulling out of a private drive on Fifth Line.

A near head-on collision occurred between the southbound vehicle and a northbound Kia SUV being driven by a 30 year old Acton man. The impact forced the northbound automobile

into the east-side ditch where it rolled on its side, temporarily trapping the driver and his 28 year old wife.

A crew from the Halton Hills Fire Department arrived quickly on the scene and used their heavy extrication tools ("Jaws of Life) to remove the two occupants within 20 minutes, according to Deputy Chief Bruce Morrison.

"It wasn't that the car was crushed, the vehicle was on its side. But the best way to gain access to the individuals was to remove the windshield and a portion of the roof," Morrison said. "Working with our EMS partners we were able to deliver them to their care."

The driver of the Kia and his wife were taken to hospital in Georgetown, where the woman was later transferred to Hamilton General Hos-

into the east-side ditch pital with serious but where it rolled on its stable injuries.

The driver of the southbound vehicle was taken to hospital in Georgetown with serious but stable injuries while his wife was also taken to Hamilton General Hospital with more serious injuries. The 22 year old Halton Hills resident in the other car was not injured.

"It looks like everyone is going to survive," according to Detective-Constable Chris Heffernan, the reconstructionist at the scene for the Halton Regional Police Service. "There were a lot of fractures and things like that."

Det-Constable Heffernan thinks it's too early to determine if any charges will be laid. "At this point there is no indication that there was any intent involved, so it's doubtful that there will be any criminal charges," he said.
