Three drivers facing charges after traffic stops

Halton Regional Police embarked on Project Juno on Thursday, targeting impaired drivers in the region, which resulted in charges laid against a Georgetown man early Saturday evening.

Officers were conducting a mobile Reduce Impaired Driving Everywhere (RIDE) program on Main St. N. in Georgetown when a black Dodge pick-up truck was spotted being driven erratically, the police

report stated.

The vehicle was pulled over in the area of Carnaby and Tiffany Lns. The officer spoke with the driver and developed grounds to believe the accused had consumed alcohol. police allege.

The accused s licence was automatically suspended for 90 days and his vehicle seized for one week.
