Nick (Carter) has been in the game for 20 years, Talevski said. And we stole the show out of every venue.

Back in 2010, Talevski opened for the Backstreet Boys during their reunion tour. To Talevski's surprise, Nick Carter remembered him and offered him advice on his performance.

Nick Carter himself was always giving me tidbits on how to work the stage and interact with fans, he said. It makes sense why hes a star. In the moment, seeing him, you start to understand.

By the end of the tour, Talevski couldn t believe how fast the time had gone.

It was only a three week tour, but it seems like it didn t even happen almost, he laughed. You re on, all day. After the tour, the first day felt three years ago. You do so much, it s so nuts.

They say no human body s meant to go through those types of schedules, but it s worth it in the long run.

When the tour wrapped up, Talevski

found himself performing at the Cavalcade of Lights in Toronto something no other Halton Hills resident has done.

That s a huge deal, as an artist, to do, he said. I underestimated it. I thought there would be 5,000 people there, and then they told me there was 25,000 people in the audience. When I left, they told me it was over 50,000.

In January, Talevski will be releasing a duet with Markham artist Aleesia and the song, deep in his gut, is going to skyrocket him into stardom.

Between the interviews, the performances and the connections he s made, Talevski sees his audience grow and can t wait to see what's coming in the

The feeling that I get as soon as the show is done, I don t know if you would call it endorphins or an adrenaline rush, but it s all worth it, no matter how hungry or tired you are, he said. To put your mic out into the audience and they re singing your own lyrics, it s the best feeling.
