Toronto Rock starts season with three locals on roster

When the Toronto Rock takes the floor in Rochester, N.Y. Thursday night to begin its 2017 National Lacrosse League regular season against the Knighthawks, three Halton Hills natives are expected to be in the lineup.

Following the retirements of franchise legends Colin Doyle and Josh Sanderson, the Rock has welcomed an infusion of youth on the roster and one of the bright spots in training camp was Georgetown s Mike MacDonald.

MACDONALD We re breaking camp with five rookies on the active roster and three guys going into their second year in Mikey MacDonald, Dan Lintner and Turner Evans, said Rock head coach Matt Sawyer.

We took the best available guys and five of them are rookies. All three of our practice roster players are also rookies. We re looking to get better as a team for now and for the future, he added.

There s new guys and a lot of players returning. There is a different atmosphere any time you make this many changes. We have a good mix of skill and athleticism amongst our young players and we feel we have that same mix of skill and athleticism in our vet-

MacDonald, a 23-year-old forward and Princeton University field standout, signed as a free agent with the Rock in the summer and made an indelible impression in training camp, scoring twice in each of Toronto s three exhibition games.

> The former Halton Hills Jr. B Bulldog has recovered from hip problems after getting drafted in the third round by New England last year, appearing in just two games with the Black Wolves before being released.

Entering his 16th NLL season, Acton native Sandy Chapman has spent all but three of those years with the Rock and is the teams longtime alternate captain.

The 5-foot-9, 190-pound defender turns 36 on Jan. 23 and has five NLL Champion s Cups during his career, including four with
