Governor General David Johnston named internationally renowned opera singer and Georgetown native, Russell Braun, as an Officer to the Order of Canada last week.

Braun, 51, will join two other appointees from Halton Region as part of the class of 2016. In all, 100 members, officers and companions were named to what is considered one of Canada's highest civilian honours by the Governor General on Dec. 30.

Fellow opera singer Michael Schade from Oakville received an honourary appointment for his achievements as a renowned tenor and his contributions to the world of opera.

The Weather Network and MétéoMédia head, Pierre Morrissette, another Oakville resident, was also appointed as a Member for his years of leadership in business.
