Police searching for fugitive facing more than 25 charges

The Halton Regional Police Service is asking anyone with information as to the whereabouts of a fugitive to contact police.

The Burlington Offender Management Unit is searching for 22-year-old Mohamed

Ozor of Quebec, in relation to several charges stemming from a series of alleged commercial break and enters in April 2016.

Police allege Ozor committed three commercial break and enters on North Service Road in Burlington in April of last year. An alarm was set off during one of the incidents when officers arrived, Ozor was arrested inside one of the commercial premises in question.

Police added Ozor was on probation at the time of his arrest and was charged with three counts of Break and Enter, one count of Failing to Comply with Probation, and one count of Obstruct Police Officer.

According to a release sent Friday (Dec. 30), the accused has since failed to appear to court in answer to the charges and is now wanted by the HRPS with an added charge of Fail to Appear in Court.

Ozor is also wanted in by Toronto police for six counts of break and enter and is currently on charge in Quebec for 13 more

counts of break and enter.


The suspects whereabouts are currently unknown but police said he is known to frequent Montreal, Burlington, Toronto and the surrounding areas. Ozor is described as 5-foot-11, 220 pounds with black hair and brown eyes.
