Officers assigned to Project Juno have wrapped up for another holiday season. However, Halton Regional Police remind the public that officers are on the lookout for impaired drivers 365 days of the year.

Project Juno is a response unit of officers who were patrolling the roads throughout the month of December, employing RIDE programs and other enforcement methods in order to stop impaired drivers.

The HRPS invited an Independent & Free Press reporter to ride alongside Acting Sgt. David Rivers for three hours on the Saturday night before Christmas in the north Halton area to get an idea of what officers encounter during a regular shift.

Freezing rain had resulted in several serious accidents in the area that night and even construction-snarled Steeles Ave. in Hornby has few vehicles on it.

But Rivers has a number of locales to visit Acting Sgt. David Rivers of the Halton Regional in Acton and Georgetown in his unmarked cruiser, observing for types of driver behaviour from patrons in the parking lot or behind the wheel of a vehicle.
