In December, regional council approved the C01H Budget, which provides the financial plan for maintaining service levels in the community while making strategic investments and keeping the tax rate increase for regional services within the rate of inflation. Highlights in the C01H Budget include investments in state-of-good-repair for infrastructure, paramedic services, the Halton Region - Community Investment Fund, a long-term water strategy and adjustments to rate revenue and structure.
