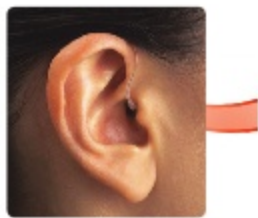

Halton Region calls out province on transfer payments

Halton Region continues to experience funding shortfalls in public health programs, including paramedic services. In total, this represents a funding shortfall of \$9.7 million in 2017, added Halton's Jan. 27 release. To responsibly and effectively support mandated growth, provincial funding investments are required.

Municipalities do not have the adequate revenue tools to satisfy the growth pays for growth principle. As a result of these limitations, there is an estimated funding gap of \$14.1 million per year and combined, there exists a tax impact of 10 per cent on the regional portion of property taxes to the residents of Halton.

In an email response to the IFP from the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing received Friday (Feb. 3), the government said it's sticking to its plans, but promises more funding for Halton is planned.

Halton Region and its area municipalities will benefit from over \$26 million in combined municipal supports and ben-

efit uploads in 2017, an increase of approximately \$2.3 million from 2016 funding, said ministry spokesperson Mark Cripps. This year, Halton Region and its area municipalities will also receive \$5.9 million in gas tax funding. Last week, Premier (Kathleen Wynne) announced the government will be doubling gas tax funding to Ontario municipalities.

It's unclear whether Halton Region has already taken into account the transfers and increases mentioned above in its budgetary and long-term fiscal calculations, but Cripps insists the provincial government has been steadily increasing municipal transfers and is willing to work with the region on additional projects Halton deems as priorities.

Since 2003, transfers to municipalities have increased on average 264 per cent. That percentage is higher than any other government priority, he said. We're always willing to listen to municipalities and work with local communities to find ways to invest in their top priorities.
