New candy shop satisfies sweet tooth

Saturday saw the grand opening of Rockwood's newest store, "Sweet and Nutty," and the place was packed with locals helping owner Max Gobran celebrate, with Mayor Chris White on hand for the requisite ribbon cutting. Gobran is filling the candy gap left by the Village Sweet Shoppe, which operated next door for many years. Owner Leah Youngblut was ready for a break from running a store,

but not from her passion for sweets, and Gobran is carrying her fudge and seasonal chocolate products. Gobran—a chef in his earlier life—and his wife moved to Rockwood in 2010, selling candy before under the name "Jewels and Fine Nuts" at a market near Mavis Rd. and Dundas St. in Mississauga. They started a family shortly after moving to Rockwood Ridge, and love the town's mix of demographics and geography that make it a "hip

commuter town." They now live behind the shop, and their two children get to learn all about the business, chiefly the need for professional attire and behaviour at all times—like no p.j.s and no fighting in front of the customers. As for the chocolates, they're the creation of accredited master chocolatier Chef Luccio, and are a minimum 72.5 per cent cocoa butter and 'A' grade. Whatever product doesn't sell is donated to food banks.

Multi-jurisdictional investigations underway to solve suspicious fires

Criminal Investigators from Wellington County Ontario Provincial Police (OPP), West Region OPP Support Unit, Guelph Police Service, Halton Police Service along with the Office of the Ontario Fire Marshall Emergency Management (OFMEM) and surrounding Fire Departments continue to investigate a number of unsolved, suspicious fires of abandoned structures in their respective jurisdictions.

This multi-jurisdictional investigation is based on community safety and finding the person (s) responsible for setting these fires. To date there are a total of 14 fires that are being treated as suspicious and will be investigated as such until proven otherwise.

- Secure unlocked structures
- Consider motion sensing cameras
- Request neighbours to watch the property
- Make regular visits to view the property
