

Metrolinx is in the process of considering bids to move the GO train station mobility platform. According to Metrolinx spokesperson Kim Johnson, "Acton GO station is the last station on the Kitchener corridor to receive platform upgrades to increase capacity along the line. The platform is being relocated to increase capacity on the Kitchener GO line beyond Georgetown-including Acton."

The current platform will be switching places with the shelter located just to the south of the ramp. The new platform will be built to the same size and standard as the one now being used. "One accessible platform will be in service for all trains for the duration of the construction," say Johnson. "Construction is expected to be completed by the end of summer 2017."
