Petition launched for new traffic signals at Guelph and McFarlane

A petition has been launched calling on Dinneen and Bruce Hayward, to bring

the Ministry of Transportation to install new traffic signals at the intersection of Guelph St. (Hwy. 7) and McFarlane Dr./Hall Rd. in Georgetown.

Town of Halton Hills Mayor Rick Bonnette and Wellington-Halton Hills MPP Ted Arnott say the lights are justified because of the difficulty turning off of McFarlane Dr. and Hall Rd. on to Guelph St.

Guelph St. is a busy provincial highway. People who live in the subdivisions off of Hall Rd. and McFarlane Dr., including The Sands condominium, have expressed serious concerns about the safety at this intersection and the difficulty they have turning onto Guelph St., Bonnette said.

We have been working together, along with local residents including Jim

these concerns to the attention of the Ministry of Transportation. added.

According to the Town of Halton Hills, many residents on the south side of Guelph St. are avoiding the intersection altogether because of the danger and difficulty turning left off of Hall Rd.

This is diverting traffic through a residential subdivision to reach Delrex

There is also significant new residential development in the area, which will only increase the volume of traffic turning onto Guelph St. Arnott said.


