Hope remains youth centres can be saved

We just couldn't afford to do it anymore, said Links2Care CEO Kate Power, adding dedicated employees and volunteers are severely overstretched.

The Town of Halton Hills has added free programming at community centres in hopes of filling some of the gaps left by the closures, but the youth who use them are sorry to see the centres go.

According to one Georegtown high school student, Ivy-Lynne Halis, a Facebook group aimed at saving the centres started by teens who use them garnered more than 250 followers in just a few hours.

Over the years, (the centres) have provided a safe space for youth, homes when needed, and basic necessities that some were not always able to afford, said Halis.

Besides the help they have given our community, they have created a safe space for every kind of person. We were not judged, or discriminated against. From the richest to the poorest of teenagers, we were given a place to be treated the same ly, she added.

Although Links2Care has announced

the centres closings, Power said she is hopeful the programs could be saved between now and the end June, but it would require another organization or group assuming operations for that to happen.

I know youth are speaking up and I think that s terrific, said Powers.

We were really hoping we could find somebody who could or would (take over) and we were not successful, she said. As a result of our inability to find someone to operate them or take them on, they may close. Forgive me for being an optimist, but we re not at the end of the road yet.

In the meantime, Powers said Links-2Care is working with the Town of Halton Hills to help the community transition to a more sustainable youth services network.

We know that the town has stepped up and they re still assessing what their capabilities are, and they ve made a good start, said Powers.

I think at this point we will be working with the town and the youth services network to see what can evolve, she said, adding Links2Care hopes to remain active in other areas within the network should such a demand exist.
