The study will be conducted in accordance with the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act and the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Process.

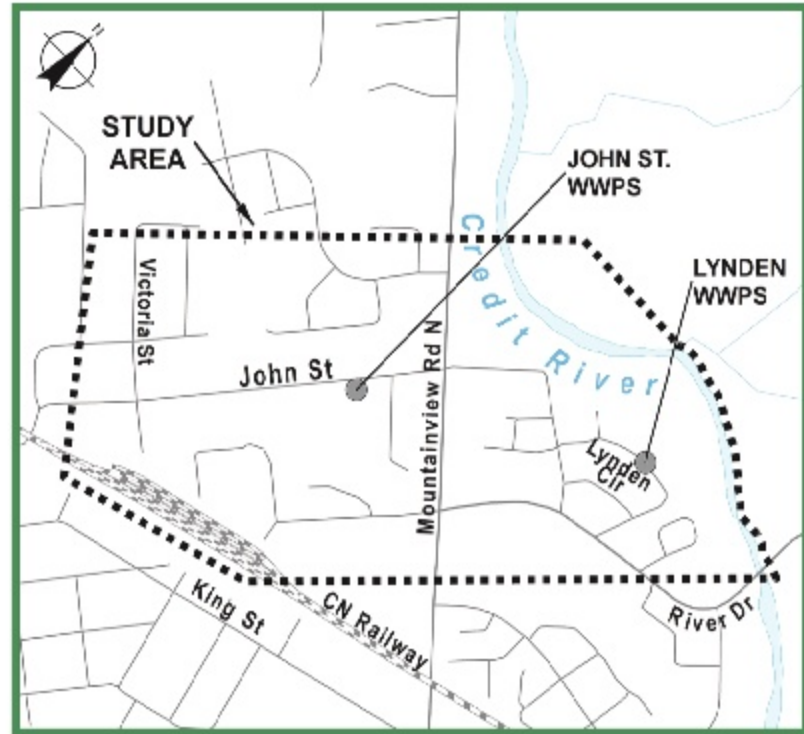
Process

The study process will consist of the following steps: 1. Site Visit: A site visit will be conducted to assess the current conditions at the proposed location. 2. Public Consultation: A public consultation process will be held to gather input from the community. 3. Final Report: A final report will be prepared and submitted to the Council for approval.
