A crew from the Town of Halton Hills took the tree down not long after it fell, using a chainsaw to cut it up into pieces.

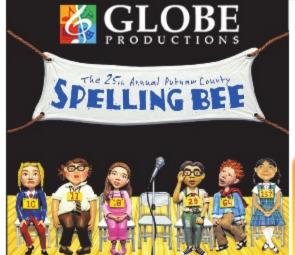
The only damage was done to a fence on
