Pandora follows her people around looking for attention. She will approach people and once she is sure they mean her no harm she will allow being picked up and snuggled. She has a permanent wide-eyed expression, which makes her running and playing more animated. 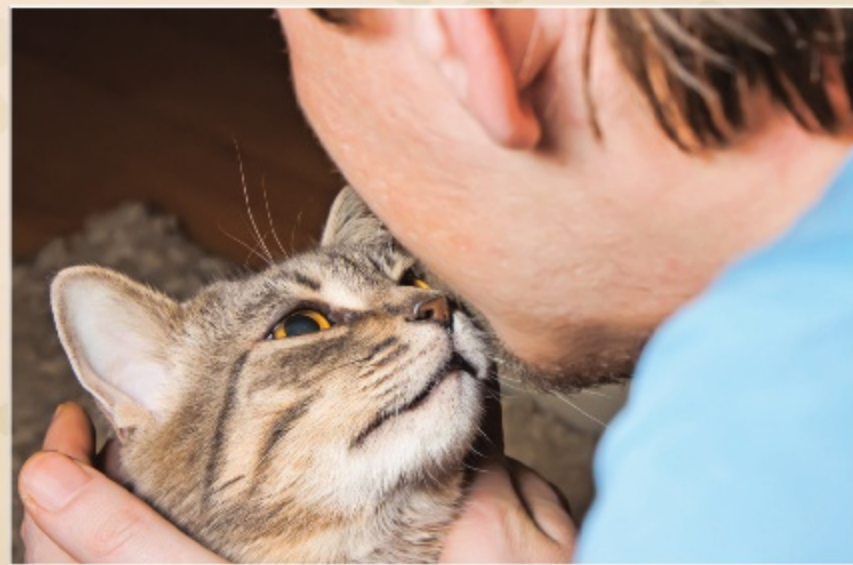
Pandora tolerates other cats but does not engage them in play. She could share a home with
