

MPP Ted Arnott goes to bat for Rockwood before Ministry of Transportation

An intersection at the south end of Rockwood has been at the centre of controversy since École Harris Mill Public School opened in 2014. Pedestrian traffic across Highway 7 has increased considerably, and the issue made its way to the Ontario Legislature on February 22 when Wellington MPP Ted Arnott read out a petition signed by over 400 residents, requesting that the Ministry of Transportation fund the full signalization they indicated they preferred. The intersection involves MacLennan St. to the west of the highway, which leads to the school and Dunbar St. to the east, where many students live.

Guelph/Eramosa Township has been grappling with the problem for nearly three years. Despite a wellsigned crossing, bright green signs, safety vests and flashing lights, drivers are not getting the message to slow down and pay attention.

The only thing in the town's view that will stop drivers, literally, is a red light, which could either be enabled by the push of a button, or installing a full set of traffic lights, but which involves a complete rebuild of the intersection to include turning lanes. Mayor White would take either, as long as it gets done as soon as possible.

The issue is funds: the MTO told the town that it preferred full signalization but would not pay for it. The town is in no position to cover the \$500,000 cost. In the interim, local residents like Jen MacLeod were instrumental in getting the petition together.

Arnott, White, Transportation Minister Steven Del Duca, as well as Treasury Board Secretary Liz Sandals recently reviewed the situation, agreeing that whatever the MTO decides, the time to do it is now, not later. The town for its part has dedicated funds toward design work so things are ready to go as soon as the ministry decides. Full signalization would require provincial funds; a pedestrian-operated red light at \$60,000 could be covered by the

For Mayor White and residents, the urgency is not about which option, it's about getting that red light in place before tragedy strikes, saying "We need to get in there and put a red light up."
