

Concerns raised over proposed Memorial Arena condo development

Markowitz explained the site was declared surplus land by council in 2012 and put up for sale. Amico later purchased the lands and seven other surrounding properties.

Council's original plans for the site set a maximum five-storey limit for any fu-

ture development, which Amico is seeking to amend to an allowable height of six storeys. They are also looking to increase the original floor space index to allow for a larger footprint.

Markowitz added the primary access to the site will be off Mill Street with secondary access off Dayfoot Drive, and clarified the developer is prepared to comply

with minimum parking standards.

The meeting concluded with council deferring any decisions on the matter until after town staff had an opportunity to review resident concerns and report back with their findings and recommendations.

Residents are able to request notifications of progress regarding the proposal

by leaving their names with Markowitz in the foyer outside council chambers at Town Hall, or with the town clerk's office during regular business hours.

Those unable to attend the public meeting can still offer comment and levy any concerns by registering as a delegation with the town clerk next time the matter is brought before council.

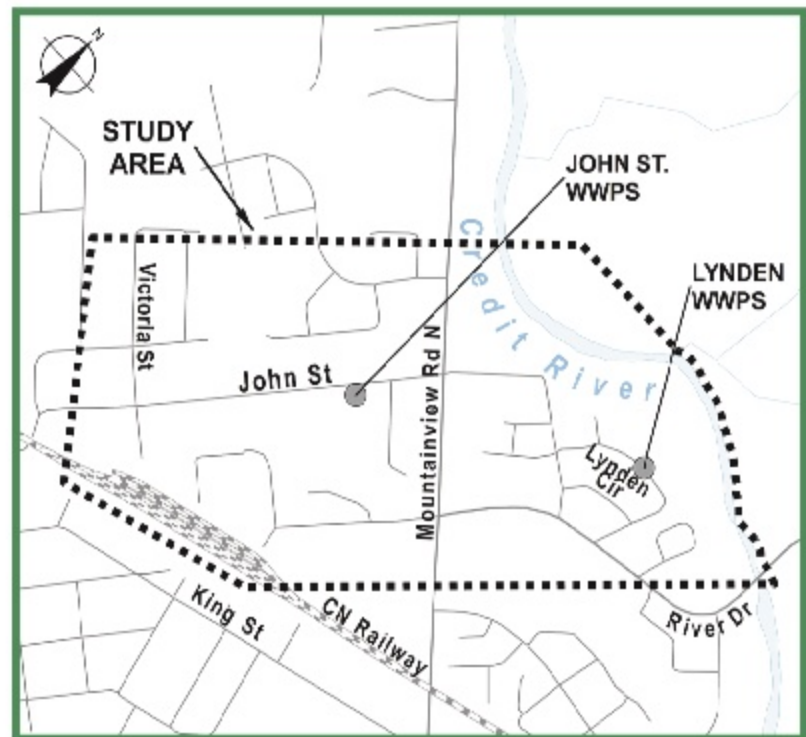
