

Dave and Dale have been lifelong collectors of art, covering many styles.

As the collection has started to outgrow their home, they have been donating to local and regional art centres and providing artworks to local charities for silent auctions to raise funds.

These organizations include: CAShh, Wastewise, Helson Gallery, Georgetown Public Library, the Devereaux House and a major gift to the University of Toronto of their cherished animation archive materials, to name just a few.

They have given freely of their time to educate others in the community, including an animation seminar at the Williams Mill and mentoring young people.

Dave and Dale formed Team Glen Williams for the Walk for the Georgetown Hospital and have been recognized by the hospital for this on-going contribution.

They support community projects with their time including Artsweek, Light up the Hills and the Halton Hills Cultural Round-

The Coxes have been honoured by the Glen Williams Canada Day Committee for their support and Dave was also inducted into the Georgetown District High School Wall of Fame.
