Leading series 3-1 with berth in Dudley Hewitt Cup within grasp

Raiders can finish off Blades tonight

A trip to the Dudley Hewitt Cup is just one win away for the Georgetown Raiders, who have the Oakville Blades on the brink of elimination after a 5-3 road victory Tuesday night.

The Ontario Junior Hockey League's top regular season team leads the second-seeded Blades 3-1 in their best-of-7 South/West Conference final series with the opportunity to knock out their Halton Region neighbours on the friendly Alcott Arena ice Thursday beginning at 7:30 p.m.

Georgetown struck for four power-play markers Tuesday and outshot the hosts 47-30 while holding intermission leads of 2-1 and 4-1.

But the Blades scored twice early in the final period and were pressing for the equalizer before taking another penalty that resulted in Raider Andrew Court putting in a rebound that served as enough insurance in front of a sparse gathering at the Sixteen Mile Sports Complex.

Last-year forward Keegan Blasby led the offensive charge with a goal and two assists, with Jack

Griffin James opened the scoring for the Raiders and fel-

low blueliner Austin Cho tallied with 13 seconds left in the second stanza to give his side a three-goal advantage.

Netminder Nicholas Latinovich improved to 5-0 in the post-season as head coach Greg Walters hasn t hesitated to use a platoon system alongside league goalie-of-the-year Josh Astorino.

In the final seconds Tuesday, Raiders leading playoff goal scorer Jordan Crocker was knocked woozy on a hit from behind by Oakville's Jackson Bales, meaning that the Blades captain will be suspended for Thursday's contest.

In the North/West Conference final the Trenton Golden Hawks defeated Cobourg 3-2 in OT again on Tuesday to take a 3-0 lead over the Cougars.

Should the Golden Hawks and Raiders win their respective series, Georgetown would automatically advance to the Dudley Hewitt Cup championship tournament May 2-6 as Trenton is the host club.

If the Blades extend the series, a sixth game would be played at Oakville's SMSC Saturday at 7:30 p.m.

Georgetown has yet to lose at the Alcott Arena this season at 33-0-1-0, including 7-0 in the postseason.
