


## Use caution near waterways

The spring thaw and recent rains have left the ground saturated and high water levels in ponds and streams. Caution should be used near any bodies of water as banks can be unstable.

Widespread flooding is not anticipated, however fast flowing water and flooding of low lying areas and natural floodplains may be expected.

Conservation Halton is asking all residents and children to stay away from all watercourses and structures such as bridges, culverts and dams. Elevated water levels, fast flowing water, and slippery conditions along stream banks continue to make these locations extremely dangerous.
