List of Town roads to be resurfaced this year

Starting this spring, select streets will benefit from road resurfacing and reconstruction.

This construction project is known as ROADS 2017. Each year, the Town's Pavement Management and Capital Works Program renews and improves roads across Halton Hills to keep them in peak condition.

Work plans are developed on the basis of priority needs and leveraging construction efficiencies. In 2017, the program will focus on upgrading road s in Wards 1 and 2.

The Town of Halton Hills is continuing its efforts to keep our roads in good repair, said Mayor Rick Bonnette. We know that each street construction project impacts area residents and businesses however the disruption is short-term while the results of ROADS 2017will provide long-reaching improvements for years to come.

The following streets will have road resurfacing completed this season, supervised and administered by Town staff.

Ward 1

Burbank St.: Elmore Dr. to end Elizabeth Dr.: Main St. N. to Elmore Dr. Elmore Dr.: 80m south of Elizabeth Dr. to Lakeview Ave.

Tidey Ave.: Elizabeth Dr. to Elmore Driv.



Tyler Avenue: Elizabeth Drive to Elmore Dr.

Main St. N. (Hwy. 7): St. Albans Dr. to 500m N.


