High School presents interactive Romeo and Juliet

Acton High drama teacher Jen Ross first had the idea of using the school's 'bear pit' gathering place to host plays about 15 years ago. Shakespeare in the Pit' happens every third year and this season's Romeo

and Juliet will take audience interaction to a new level. "It started with last year's play, Fuenteovejuna, and it worked. So, "Go big or go home!" Ross enthuses. "People can choose to be engaged right from when they arrive in the parking lot." It's also fine to simply

come and enjoy the play. "All grades are involved, well over 100 kids. Woodshop is building sets; Art students are painting them." Shakespeare's tragedy of star-crossed lovers hinges on bitter rivalry between two feuding families, the Capulets

and the Montagues. "Kids started staying til 7 p.m., making and putting up posters all over the school, playing on the rivalry." They did their own fight choreography, guided by Steve Wilsher of Humber College's Academy of Dramatic Art and Combat.

The bear-pit will be curtained off on both sides, lit, and decorated "kind of like a bootleg 1930s setting. There are narratives around the play itself and a half-time show at intermission. I've seen a lot of theatre, and I've never seen anything like this!" Ross beams. "We don't do big showy musicals because we can't afford them but because Acton is so supportive, we can try things that are a little quirky and different."

The play runs May 3, 4 and 5 at 7 p.m. A preview for the High School and M.S. Bennett will be held on the May 4. Tickets are available in advance at the School Library or at the door.




