Rockwood's Kellie Joyce spent her flower garden budget last year on hundreds of limitededition Canada 150 tulip bulbs distributed through Home Hardware stores in partnership with the National Capital Commission (NCC), the Netherlands, and Communities in Bloom. The jaunty image on the boxes promised that bulbs planted last fall would bloom red-andwhite this spring, Canada's 150th, in homage to the

Canadian flag.

"I live on the main street of Rockwood, I wanted to be patriotic, I wanted a nice show," Joyce explains. Joyce planted 500 bulbs

throughout her front garden. "It was hard work." This spring, she was surprised when bulbs of all different colours started blooming; purple, yellow, orange ... not variegated red and white, as she expected. "I thought, this is starting to

look like a bag of coloured marshmallows." So far, just one Canada Day tulip has emerged from amongst the pack.

Joyce contacted Home Hardware's head office. On Monday, the local distributor of the bulbs from

Holland drove out from Niagara to look at her garden and agreed that there must have been a distribution problem.

"There are about 40 complaints from the 519 area. He told me to look at the leaves—the Canada 150 bulbs have a white rim around the edge." Later in the day, Home Hardware's head office emailed to confirm that they would fully refund her money. "That's my real takeaway – how great everyone has been. The Head Office said they really appreciated that I'd got in touch with them.

And Paul, locally? I can't say enough good things about his customer service. He's a sweetheart; his smile makes it all worthwhile just to go into his store." Joyce laughed. "Maybe all the colours reflect Canada's diversity more than just red and white."
