## Plan shots with creativity in mind

The Players Championship is widely regarded as the fifth major in men's professional golf, so when a 21-year-old wins it as his second victory on the PGA Tour, the win is that more special.

South Korean Si Woo Kim won by three shots over the best field in golf after posting a bogey-free three-under-par 69.

The most impressive thing about his victory to me is that under that pressure he remained so calm and played his own game.

He played a couple shots that players would not sometimes try such as the driver from the rough on the 14th from 268 yards on Saturday to save par after an errant drive.

Or the hybrid putt from off the green on 18 to three feet for an easy tap in par and the victory.

The ability to think creatively and pull off the shot builds confidence. I always tell my students who are new to the game that there are no rules for where you can use your clubs on the course.

You can use any tool, anywhere just pick the right tool for the job.

The ability to make a plan for the shot based on your lie and conditions and then pick the club that makes it all work will make execution easier.

It won t always work out perfectly, but planning and committing to it will start the process.

Oh yeah. Get out and practise. But practise with a plan and some creativity never hurt.
