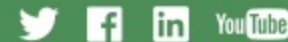
Kevin O Leary was the front-runner in the race to succeed Stephen Harper. Victory was within reach, wrote Coates.

Study

Halton Region's Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (MCEA) for the proposed 25th Avenue (from 8th to 5th) and 9th Avenue (from 25th to 20th) in Milton. The project involves the construction of a new road and the widening of existing roads. The study area is located in the north-western part of Milton, adjacent to the 401 highway. The project is being undertaken by the Halton Region and the City of Milton. The MCEA process is required under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act.

Process

The MCEA process is a multi-step process that involves the preparation of a study report, the holding of public consultations, and the preparation of a final assessment report. The study report will describe the project, the study area, and the potential impacts of the project. Public consultations will be held to provide an opportunity for the public to provide input on the project. The final assessment report will provide a detailed assessment of the project's impacts and recommend mitigation measures. The MCEA process is required under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act.
