Racing legend Mario Andretti makes appearance in Acton

For someone who retired from racing cars nearly 30 years ago, the legendary driver Mario Andretti still lives in the fast lane.

The 77-year-old Italianborn Andretti was at Queens Tire in Acton to promote Firestone tires this week and his popularity was demonstrated by the long line of autograph-seekers winding its way down the sidewalk for nearly three hours.

The only driver to have won the Indianapolis 500, Daytona 500 and Formula One World Championship has created a vast empire of business interests to go along with strong family ties in the sport of auto racing.

The Pennsylvania resident makes numerous speaking engagements, owns gas stations, go-kart

tracks, wineries, a clothing line, video games, car washes and his IndyCar race team drivers have won three of the past four Indianapolis 500s.

Andretti even dabbled in acting, appearing in three episodes of the popular TV show Home Improvement, but the man with an estimated net worth of more than \$100 million joked Wednesday that showbiz wasn't one of his strong suits.

"(Home Improvement) was the beginning and end of my acting career," he chuckled.

Fans young and old came to the Queens Tire appear-

ance, some carrying race programs and magazines from decades ago. Mario's son Michael won the Toronto Indy a record seven times and grandson Marco is currently on the IndyCar circuit.

The elder Andretti won several races north of the U.S. border over the years in various circuits and was named to the Canadian Motorsports Hall of Fame in 2013.

"T've raced in Toronto, Mosport and Montreal, you name it. My first time racing in Canada was in 1953 and my last race was in '84," he said not long after scratching his autograph on a grown man's stomach.

"I have many friends here and as you can see today the fan base is amazing. All the memorabilia people have brought for me to sign is bringing back a lot of memories."
