Legendary Toronto Maple Leafs goaltender Johnny Bower will be on hand to meet fans at the Georgetown Public Library this weekend.

The event, sponsored by the Friends of the Halton Hills Public Library and Star League Sports, will take place from 2-4 p.m. on Saturday (June 24).

Bower, now 92-years-old, was a four-time Stanley Cup Champion with the Toronto Maple Leafs during the team's heyday in the 1960s. The "China Wall" as he came to be known, enjoyed a lengthy NHL career and was inducted into the Hockey Hall of Fame in 1976.
