it. Managing their expectations is an important part of the plan to realize the results they have in mind.

We need to manage our expectations as well when we play and especially when we practise.

Every shot should start with a plan, then we execute the plan and receive feedback from the result as to whether we executed in the manner we wanted to.

Let's look at an exam-

ple. We have a green that is 100 yards away and we have our 100-yard club in our hands. If we hit one or two close to the pin and miss the green with the rest we think we hit some good shots and sometimes conveniently forget the rest.

If we hit 10 more shots and five hit the green, but none are as close as the "good ones," then we might be disappointed.

In reality, on the golf course those five greens in regulation are going to produce more positive results on the scorecard although they weren't as rewarding as the "good ones."


