According to the release, she also refused to identify herself to police. Her violent behaviour continued in the back of the cruiser on the way to the station for processing, and the vehicle was damaged as a result. Once at the station, Halton police said the woman continued to withhold her identity and was held over for a bail hearing until the next day until she could be identified.

The accused was eventually identified as Ivonne McKee of no fixed address.

She is facing numerous charges stemming from the incident including three counts of assaulting a peace officer, one count of resisting arrest, one count of mischief under \$5,000, and one count of obstructing police. McKee is next scheduled to appear in court for a bail hearing on July 27.
