## Show will go on at Georgetown Little Theatre

Damage from a suspicious fire on Aug. 12 at the Georgetown Little Theatre Production's studio in Stewarttown wasn't as extensive as first feared and the group will begin its 57th season Aug. 25-26 without missing a beat.

The building on Stewarttown Road is being cleaned, repaired, and ventilated this week and is expected to be ready for the Georgetown Little Improv Club's performances next Friday and Saturday evening.

GLT president Virginia Bancour was thankful for the outpouring of support from other community the-

along with others from as far away as Thorold and Woodstock and the Town of Halton Hills.

Halton Regional Police initially stated in a press release that damage to the interior of the building was extensive, but Bancour said this week that thankfully the damage was minimal, mainly caused by smoke.

It's believed that a break-and-enter to the building took place at around 10 p.m. on Aug. 12 and that the perpetrator(s) ignited a fire at the bottom of the stairs leading to the props and costumes rooms.

Andrea Gaynor, an investigator with the Ontario Fire Marshal, said that a heat detector alarm saved

the building from more extensive damage because members of the Halton Hills Fire Department were able to respond quickly to extinguish the fire.
