You see, she has an obsession about getting her head stuck.

When she was weaned from her mom at six weeks, she decided to stick her head through the slats in the hay rack.

I'd have to get into the pen, lift her up and turn her body a bit, so she could pull out her head.

At first, it was intermittent.

Then it became twice a

Finally, it got to the point where I'd go into the barn, get her head out, and before I was finished feeding, she'd have it stuck again. Her record was four times in one feeding.

I moved her to another pen, with narrower slates in the hay feeder.

She got her head stuck in the gate that opens into the pen.

I divided the pen in half with plywood. That held her -for a while.

With lambs, it's one of those annoying things you simply have to wait out.

Eventually, her head will get too big to go through the opening.

Last week, I started to feel I had won. She hadn't put her head through any opening in a few weeks - I was home free.

Wrong.

It always happens when you're going to some event. I walked in the door, and there she stood, her head stuck through a hole in the pen slats, where there is a steel pipe bolted to the wooden side of the pen.

In all my years in the barn, I have NEVER seen an animal push his or her head through that spot.

I tried to turn her head and push her back through. She pushed back. (And she's now getting big enough to be able to push back.)

I tried a number of angles and positions. I was soaked in sweat and I couldn't get her head out.

To add to the situation, the other lambs in the pen joined with her, bleating at the top of their little lungs in joyful harmony.

I tell ya, there was a moment you could have bought a flock of sheep, pretty cheap.

After struggling for what seemed like hours, the solution became obvious.

I had to dismantle the end of the pen.
