


Highfield, a 21-year-old forward, scored four times in the Arrows' tournamentopening 9-7 victory over the Okotoks Raiders and went on to finish fourth overall in scoring with five goals and nine assists in six games as Six Nations went undefeated

to claim its third national Jr. A championship in four years.

More than 1,300 spectators packed into Memorial Arena for the Arrows' titleclinching 8-3 triumph Thursday night over the Coquitlam Adanacs, who led the game 3-2 after the first period. Six Nations swept Coquitlam in the best-of-5 final series.

The six-foot-two, 200-pound Highfield now heads into his senior year on a field scholarship at the University of Massachusetts-Lowell.

The defending Ontario Junior Hockey League-champion Raiders had several veterans on the ice for Saturday night a 3-1 victory in Oakville over the Blades, the same side Georgetown will face in a homeand-away series on the opening weekend of the regular season.
