## **Public warning siren testing**

On Thursday, September 28 at 10 a.m., Saputo Inc. will be performing a siren testing, in collaboration with the Town of Halton Hills. This test of the public warning system is part of sound risk management practices meeting Environment Canada's regulatory requirements.

Residents of Halton Hills should know that no specific action is required on their part during the September 28 siren testing.

Saputo uses ammonia for cooling in their manufacturing and storage process at the plant located at 279 Guelph Street, Georgetown. Ammonia is a well-known and commonly-used refrigerant in commercial and industrial operations. While no major leaks have occurred at this facility, Saputo's preparedness efforts involve informing and educating the public and having a what-do-to strategy in place.

The primary responsibility of the Halton Hills Fire Department is to ensure the safety and well-being of residents and property. It is with this in mind that the department partnered with Saputo to ensure accurate and timely information on safety protocols was produced and distributed.

An informational pamphlet will be distributed in an approximate 2 km area around the Saputo plant. The message tells people to 'shelter in place' should they hear a three minute, loud wailing siren. The siren will emit a long continuous tone for one minute when the danger has passed. Firefighters will also be visiting area businesses and providing notification to specific populations such as schools and seniors' buildings.

"The siren activation system is a commonlyused method in emergency preparedness to provide early and effective notification to the community," said Halton Hills Fire Chief John deHooge.

Mayor Rick Bonnette noted, "The siren may be unfamiliar to people so I encourage residents to ensure their whole family knows what the siren means and which procedures to follow when they hear it."


