In the coming months, the Town of Halton Hills will move to a new digital procurement management platform 'bids&tendersTM' utilized by hundreds of municipalities across North America. The new tool allows suppliers to view, download and submit bids entirely online in one quick, easy and convenient location using realtime technology to provide current information such as questions, answers, addenda and reminders.

"I'm pleased to see the Town continue to adopt new and best practices," said Mayor Rick Bonnette. "It's important that municipalities work together to leverage purchasing opportunities to ensure we get the best value."

Suppliers interested in bidding on goods and services for the Town or any of the area municipalities need to set up an account with bidsandtenders.ca. An annual subscription fee of \$165 provides unlimited access to local opportunities or any of the 300 plus agency opportunities available nation-wide. Selective bids are available as onetime fee options for \$45 each. Additional project document fees may be ap-

The bids&tenders system offers suppliers many features including:

- Online bid submissions
- Track and manage bids at a glance with a custom, vendor dashboard
- Select personalized categories
- Receive automated email notifications of new bid opportunities, including addenda
- Work on a bid, save work, and see the bid closing countdown in real-time
- Withdraw and change bids, then resubmit if desired
- Receive automated confirmations when bids have been submitted, received, or withdrawn
- Eliminate mathematical errors with the built-in calculator
- Submit complete and compliant bids every time with the built-in compliance checker
- Receive reminders if a bid has been started but not submitted 24 hours from bid close

## **Local Police stations cutting hours**

Halton Police Service has reduced the hours that their stations will be open in Halton Hills,

Milton and Burlington. Starting September 1, the 1 District (11 Division) police station in Georgetown is only open from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. daily.

But the station, located at 217 Guelph Street, is equipped with public intercom that can put callers in touch with police communications

after hours.

A press release from Halton Police advised that the Georgetown police station's Community Rooms will not be available after 7 p.m.—after the building has closed. According to the memo, the changes are being made "in an effort to increase efficiency.'

Halton Police Service is also altering the hours at two other Halton Stations. The 1 District station in Milton on Childs Drive will be open from 8 a.m. to 10 p.m., and the 3 District Burlington Station on Constable Henshaw Blvd. will have the same hours of operation.

However, the 20 Division office in Oakville will remain open 24 hours a day.
