

# Former Peace Tower flag hanging in Belfountain

massive Canadian flag was brought back to life in Belfountain, thanks to former MP and Belfountain General Store owner, Garth Turner.

"The flag flew on top of the Peace Tower at Parliament Hill," said Turner,

who came into possession of it because of an effort to reinvigorate O Canada.

Turner was the MP for the Halton-Peel riding from 1988 to 1993. During that time, a constituent and local radio DJ reached out to him for financing of a

unique version of O Canada.

"He had an idea he wanted to do a recording of O Canada in a We are the World rock star style for Canada's 125th," Turner said. "It was a good idea, but he couldn't get the fi-

nancing for it."

Turner was able to secure approximately \$1 million in funding. Canadian musicians from Randy Bachman to Gino Vanelli and Rita McNeil, among others, were recruited and the song recorded. The idea

was so well received, efforts to create a new symphonic version of the anthem were begun.

Copies of the track were shared across Canada, and the entire effort culminated
