From Sept. 15-17, the Acton Fall Fair will take place at the Prospect Park Fairgrounds. Along with the exciting carnival rides, a number of animal shows will be taking place over the three days, and a number of vehicle pulls, including highway truck pull, antique tractor pull, and 4x4 truck pull.

Tickets are \$9 for adults, \$8 for seniors and students and children 12 and under are \$4. Three-day passes will be for sale prior to the event, which costs \$20 for three admissions. These

are for advance sales only, and cannot be purchased at the main gates.

Education Day: 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.: Schoolchildren, seniors and preschool children are welcome to enjoy educational displays, demonstrations, wagon rides, and interactive learning. To attend, children must be accompanied by an adult. Nonschool groups are to be no more than five children to one adult. Unaccompanied children will not be let into the grounds.

4 p.m.: Gates open; midway opens for business; Ex-

otic and domestic birds will be on display in the poultry tent; cows and other farm animals will be in the Agriculture Awareness tent; the Homecrafts exhibit will be open, featuring work from juniors, schools, baking, plants, flowers, antiques, crafts and hobbies, and needlework.

6 p.m.: Spot in the park opens.

7 p.m.: Heavy horse pull.

7-10 p.m.: Itchy Scratchy at Spot in the Park.

8 p.m.: Miss Acton Fall Fair pageant opening ceremonies.

**Saturday, Sept. 16:**

8 a.m.: Gates open.

10:30 a.m.: Baby show; beef cattle show.

11 a.m.: Midway opens.

11:30 a.m.: Heavy horse show, followed by light horse show.

12 p.m.: Horseshoe pitching; Spot in the Park open.

1-4 p.m.: Half-hour city at Spot in the Park.

5 p.m.: Garden tractor pull.

7-10 p.m.: Practically Hip performs at Spot in the Park.
