

Rebels, Jags clash in pre-season Georgetown gridiron matchup

Even though Christ the King's Jaguars have joined a new Halton/Hamilton league for the upcoming high school football season, it doesn't mean they won't play against their crosstown rivals, the Georgetown Rebels.

The local schools' senior football squads will collide in an exhibition game this Friday at Kiwanis Field beginning at 7 p.m. with no admission charge for spectators.

"It's a shame that we're not in the same league

anymore and I know this affects other really strong rivalries in Halton like the one we've had with CtK," said Rebels' second-year head coach John Leckie.

"Having played against CtK in those games, I know how important it is to keep our rivalry going and (Jaguars' head coach) Paul Gellatly feels the same way, so hopefully we can get a good crowd out to watch it."

The Rebels are coming off their best season in several years, having advanced to the Halton Sec-

ondary School Association Tier I semifinals before bowing out to the eventual Golden Horseshoe Bowl champs from Nelson in Burlington. Leckie added that several players are coming back for a fifth season.

The first 200 students with a valid photo ID card to attend Friday's contest will receive a Rebels' T-shirt.

Because it's being played during the first week back at school, the game will not include special teams action.
