Police looking for break-and-enter

suspects

The second is a black man about six-foot-three with dreadlock-style hair, wearing sunglasses on top of his head, camouflage jacket and shirt, blue jeans with black and white shoes.

It's not clear if the third person was a man, but he or she had a dark hoodie, dark pants, a white scarf covering the face and was carrying a red backpack.
