## Police searching for suspect after stabbing and car theft in Halton Hills

Halton police are reaching out to the public for information as they search for a suspect wanted for stabbing a man before fleeing in the victim's car in Halton Hills.

Police said they responded to a call to a residence on Trafalgar Road just north of Steeles Avenue on Sunday, Sept. 17 just before 10 a.m. They discovered a man with stab wounds to his bicep and chest.

The victim was treated at the scene by paramedics and transported to Milton District Hospital with non-life-threatening injuries.

Police say the attacker fled the scene in the victim's 2006 Toyota Yaris.

John Reid Steele, 51, of no fixed address, is described as white, five-foot-ten and 186 pounds with long black, greying, shoulder-length hair. The stolen vehicle bares Ontario licence plate number BLZT 715. Steele is wanted for assault with a weapon and theft of a motor vehicle. Police added the suspect and victim know each other.
