U-15 Mustangs earn Peel Halton First Division crown

A 7-2 rout of Dixie Wednesday night clinched first place in the Peel Halton District Soccer Association's under-15 boys First Division for the Georgetown Mustangs with a record of 12-2-1. The Mustangs finished

11 points ahead of second-placed Mississauga and scored an average of almost five goals a game, while giving up just 24 over 15 matches. Georgetown's under-15 boys also made it to the final of the 21-team Peel Hal-

ton District Cup after defeating Erin Mills White, Ontario Khalsa Darbard and Oakville along the way, before bowing out to the undefeated Premier Division champion Erin Mills Green Eagles 5-0 last weekend in Brampton.
